UNIVERSITY OF MAINE ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS UNTIL JULY 1

The University of Maine will continue to accept applications for the fall semester until July 1. Their current online options and how to apply can be viewed [HERE](#) (click on the picture that pertains to the degree) and are:

- (1) Undergraduate certificate in surveying engineering technology
- (2) BS in surveying engineering technology (ABET ETAC accredited)
- (3) Graduate certificate in surveying engineering
- (4) Professional Science Masters in Engineering and Business surveying engineering option

The undergrad certificate is an easy application and is a good way to work into the BS degree. They currently have 280 surveying students spread across the four options.

Out-of-state students enrolled in a UMaineOnline degree or certificate program receive a low tuition e-rate which is in-state*1.25.


