

No Treasurer's Report

Guest Speakers:

Ric Moore and Dallas Sweeney from the Board of Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors and Geologists (BPELSG) touched on a few topics that we felt were important. Firstly, they gave us the run down on the pass / fail statistics over the last few years. They provided graphs showing a small growth in the number of newly licensed surveyors.


They briefly talked on the topic of responsible charge. When a surveyor becomes responsible for the data published, that responsibility does not end.

There was a healthy amount of crowd interaction in the discussion of PPCs. The Board members were in favor of such committees but felt in the past, most surveyors were unaware of the committees, and thus not utilized.

Continuing education was also discussed. Dallas and Ric mentioned that in a survey that was put out most surveyors in California were not in favor of continuing education requirements, but many attended continuing education programs/seminars.

The crowd participation was excellent in this presentation. In fact, we went quite a bit longer than normal, and closed Riley's down that Thursday evening.

IT'S THE LAW!

As Professional Land Surveyors, we are all aware, or should be, that there are a suite of related laws and regulations in the LS Act and the Board Rules that govern how we deal with the subject of monument preservation. But are you aware of the various suite of laws that govern how defacing or destroying survey monuments is handled in the courts? Destroying a monument is defined as a crime in California Penal Code and also in Street and Highways Code. Just don't forget that failing to protect or perpetuate a monument is a crime, too.

California Penal Code § 605

Every person who either:

- 1. Maliciously removes any monument erected for the purpose of designating any point in the boundary of any lot or tract of land, or a place where a subaqueous telegraph cable lies; or,
- 2. Maliciously defaces or alters the marks upon any such monument; or,
- 3. Maliciously cuts down or removes any tree upon which any such marks have been made for such purpose, with intent to destroy such marks;
- -- Is guilty of a misdemeanor.

California Penal Code § 615

Every person who willfully injures, defaces, or removes any signal, monument, building, or appurtenance thereto, placed, erected, or used by persons engaged in the United States Coast Survey, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

California Streets and Highways Code DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 3, Section 732.

Any person who willfully injures, defaces, breaks down or removes any monument or stake placed, erected or used by the department to designate any point in the boundary or survey of any State highway or proposed State highway is guilty of a misdemeanor.
